Complaint filed at the constitutional court of Organisms

We, the grasses of the area named "Chestnut Strip" or "Extension Area South East" are filing a complaint concerning multiple incidents of local and species specific discrimination. These incidents are in undisputable discord with Article 10 of UDOR "Prohibition of Discrimination"

The following decisions taken by the Parliament of Organisms are part of the systematic unequal treatment:

- 1. Decision taken on the 6th October 2018 to establish a "Walnut Zone" on our premises. This decision was declared not consistent with the constitution by the first session of the constitutional court on the 26th April 2019.
- 2. The decision also taken by parliament on the 6th October 2018 to sow insect friendly blooming plants on the very same premises.
- 3. The decision taken on the 11th May 2019 by parliament to build an artificial pond yet again in the area we call home. The pond was consequently built by the Garden Executive on the 2nd day of the Garden Executive on the 26th May 2019. 35% of our resident grassy ecotype was either relocated or covered with soil.

The grasses of the concerned area pose the accusation of systematic discrimination. They see the cause of this discrimiation in conscious or unconscious favouritism of the involved humans towards trees and shrubs. The grassy area has been chosen three times for unpopular measures such as deportation and asylum, which shows cleary that the human representatives do not consider an ecotype mainly consisting of grasses as equal to ecotypes with ligneous members. These have also been clearly priviledged by the decision to turn down a mowing of the complete area of Organisms Republic twice. Regular mowing is essential for the survival of the diversity of grasses as currently found in Organisms Republic.

## Verdict questions for the jurors

Yes, the grass dominant communities of citizens in the south eastern area of Organisms Republic have been systematically discriminated against. For compensation an area of rising ligneous organims of equal size to the installed pond and the other impaired areas must be regualrily mowed and thereby conserved as grassy ecotype.

No, the grass dominant communities of citizens in the south eastern area of Organisms Republic have not been subject to systematical discriminization. The decisions in question were taken by a democratic majority in parliament and are in accordance with the constitutionally guaranteed rights of all organisms.
